Federal, military and Social Security retirees and disabled veterans will not get a cost-of-living adjustment in 2016, the federal government announced.

## Union pushes back on higher Medicare Part B premiums

The National Treasury Employees Union is calling on Congress to pass legislation that would protect about 16 million retirees who will be hit by sharply higher premiums for Medicare Part B coverage next year.

 Federal pay back in the news

A libertarian think tank has rekindled the debate over federal civilian pay, arguing that federal employees have enjoyed years of faster compensation growth and higher pay than private-sector workers.

#### CBP hiring bill heads to president

The Senate this month unanimously approved the Border Jobs for Veterans Act, which will put veterans to work as Customs and Border Protection officers at understaffed U.S. ports of entry. The bill was sent to the president for his signature.
